Kerry Farmer—Kerry is the Director Australian Studies, developing the Australian Records certificate for the internationally recognised National Institute for Genealogical Studies. She is the author of *DNA for genealogists* and *Arrivals in Australia from 1788*. She has science and arts degrees and is one of the most highly regarded genealogy presenters in Australia.

Peter Donovan—Peter was the founding president of the Professional Historians Association (SA) and one of the prime movers in the development of the Australian Council of Professional Historians Associations Inc. He belongs to other relevant professional bodies such as Australia ICOMOS, the (American) National Council of Public History, and the Oral History Association of Australia (SA Branch). Peter was announced as South Australian Historian of the Year in 2015.

Graham Jaunay—Graham has been an accredited professional genealogist and record agent since mid-1994. He has been president of SAGHS and the Australasian Federation of Family History Organisations (AFFHO). He presents seminars and tutorials on a wide range of family history topics. He has been a WEA tutor in family history since 1995. From 2004 to 2012 he was an adjunct lecturer presenting post-graduate courses in genealogy for the History Department of the Flinders University.

Dr Sally Stephenson—Sally has worked professionally as an oral historian for more than a decade. She has used oral history to produce documentaries, to provide lively and meaningful text for interpretive panels in museums and on heritage walks and for sound installations in museums. She has undertaken projects for Australian federal and state government departments, local councils, the South Australian Maritime Museum, local museums and community groups.
