Welcome to the Queensland Expo 2012

Attending talks—Please familiarise yourself with the layout of the venue prior to your first presentation. Only those with tickets may attend. Tickets can be purchased at the registration desk (free talks do not need a ticket).

Research Help Zone —A dedicated area for product demonstrations and advice on products. It will be available from several Unlock the Past experts. We aim have at least two experts available at any one time. If there are people waiting, time for any one inquiry may be limited to 5-10 minutes.

One on One with an Expert — Bookings will be taken at the Expo for FREE 15 minute consultations with an expert of your choice. A list of times and expertise offered will be posted on the day.

Prizes totalling over \$4000 in value—These have been donated by exhibitors. There will be two prize draws during the Expo. Prizes can be collected from the Gould Genealogy table. Two draws for prizes are planned

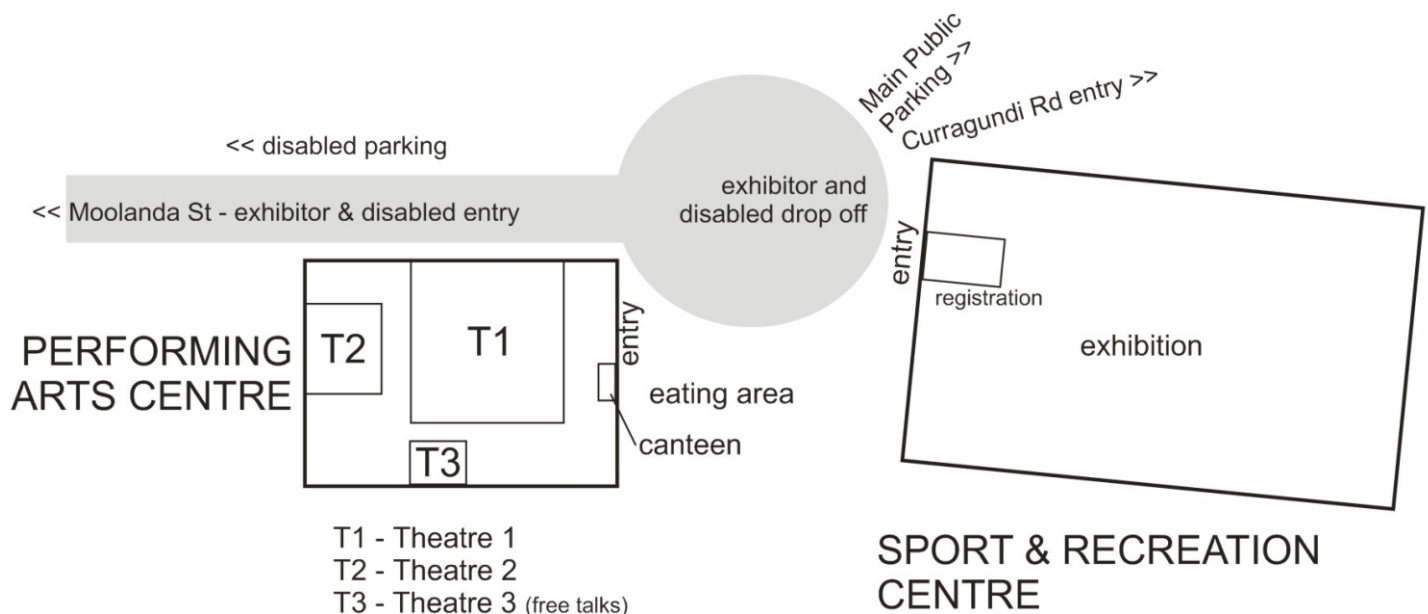
- 1st draw after lunch Tuesday. All pre-registered (by 20 June) are in this draw.
- 2nd draw after lunch Wednesday. All who submit a completed Treasure Hunt form will be in this draw—answers to basic questions which can be found at the various exhibitor tables.

Meals and refreshments

- Lunches and morning and afternoon teas will be available at a moderate price each day from the school canteen.
- The canteen will also offer an evening meal between 5.00pm and 6.30pm Monday evening.
- Food on offer will be sandwiches, rolls, focaccias, salads, hot food (pies, sausage rolls and hot dogs) as well as fried rice and spaghetti Bolognese, drinks (iced tea, water, juices, tea and coffees), biscuits, cakes, muffins, slices, sweets and chips.
- A coffee cart will also be available much of the time.
- Tables and chairs will be provided for this purpose in the area between the two buildings, near the canteen.

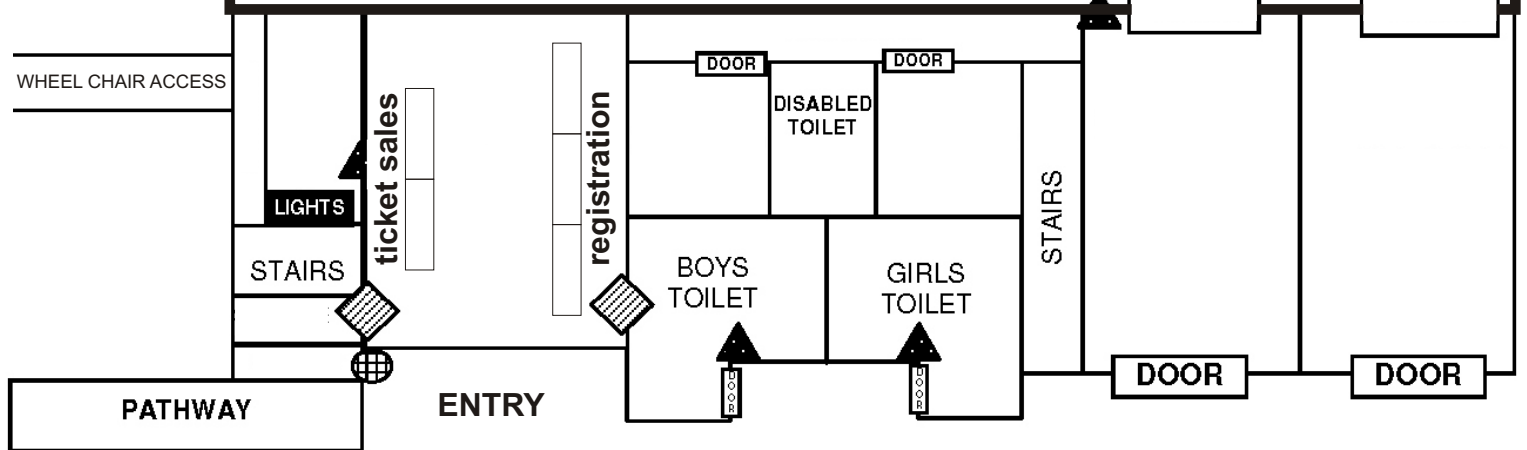
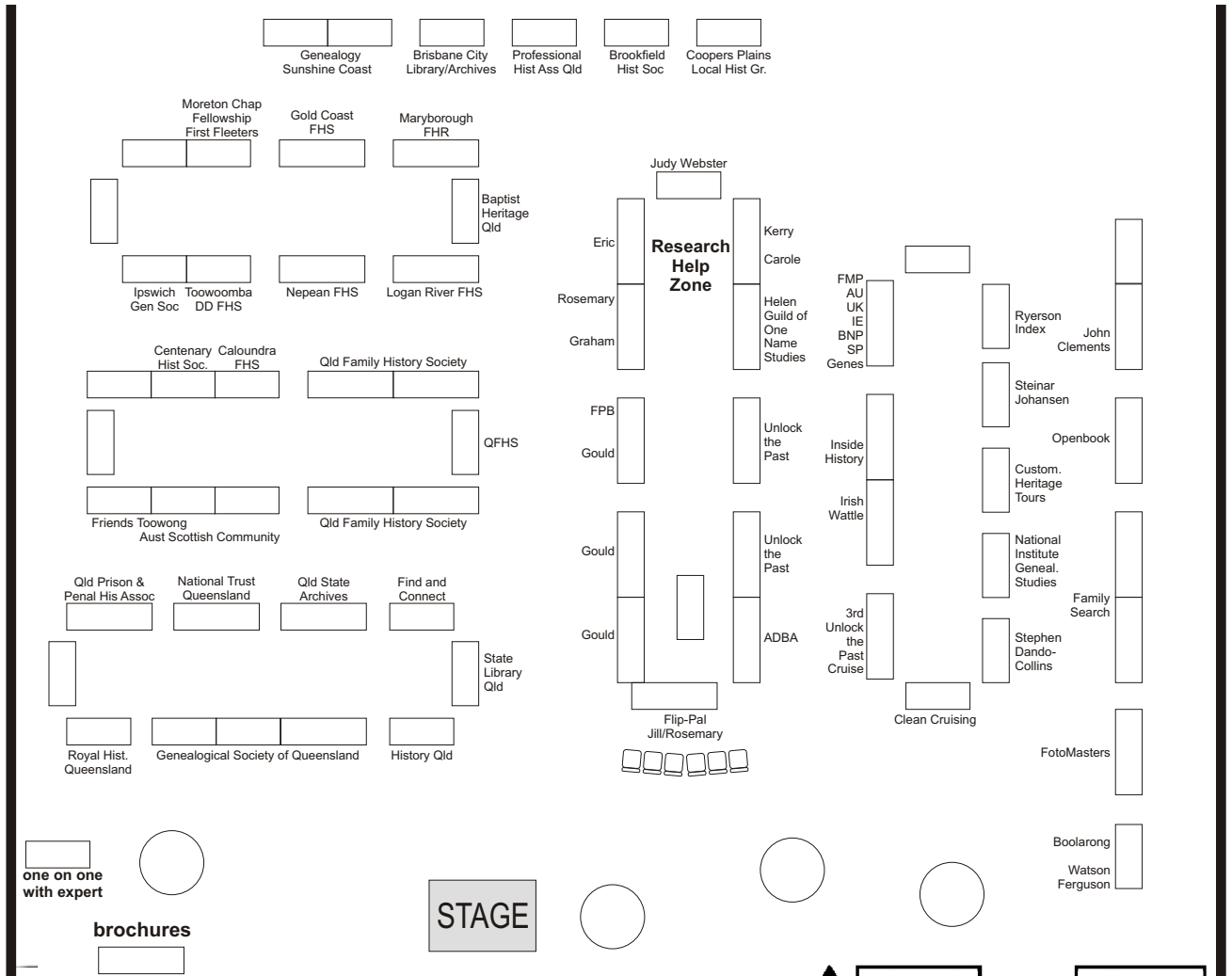
