BODY OF CHILD FOUND.

BRISBANE.—On the 9th ultimo the dead body of a male child was found on the beach at Rose Bay, Wynnum. The body was that of a child about 2½ years of age, broad face, fair hair, apparently having been well nourished. It was naked and rather decomposed when found; was wrapped in a canvas bag tied with a hemp rope 11 feet long, and a stone weighing 16½ lbs. attached to the rope. The doctor who made a *post mortem* examination stated that death was caused by inflammation of the right lung.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY AND STEALING FROM THE PERSON.

(Fide Police Gazette, 1888, page 417.)

JOHN HARRINGTON, charged with stealing from the person, has been arrested by the Bowen police. 28th January, 1889.

MEDICAL OFFICERS.

It is notified for the information of Police Officers that the following are the duties of Medical Officers and the charges to which they are entitled:—

- (1.) Attendance on members of the Police Force.
- (2.) Attendance on officers and inmates of gaols, lockups, immigration depôts, and lunatic reception houses, and other persons in charge of the police.
- (3.) Attendance on aboriginals and on Pacific Islanders when in the custody or under the charge of the Government, whether in an immigration depôt or elsewhere.
- (4.) The examination of persons in custody for the purpose of ascertaining, when necessary, the state of their bodily or mental health.
- (5.) Attendance in court to give evidence as to the health of any persons whom a medical officer has been, or might be, required to attend, when the state of their health requires to be inquired into by a court; and
- (6.) Public vaccination.

They are entitled to the fees prescribed by "The Inquests of Deaths Act of 1866," viz.:—

Mileage may be charged either at 6d. per mile in terms of Section 10 of "The Inquests of Deaths Act," or at 1s. per mile (after the first two miles) in terms of Section 15 of "The Medical Act of 1867."

It must be stated in the voucher if any inquest or magisterial inquiry has been held, in which case the expense is chargeable to, and should be transmitted to, the Attorney-General's Department. When there is no inquest or inquiry the expense will be defrayed by the Police Department.

GENERAL ORDER, No. 632.

KEEPING HORSES, COWS, AND POULTRY AT POLICE STATIONS.

SEVERAL applications having been received from members of the Force to be allowed to keep horses, cows, and poultry at Police Stations, it is hereby notified for general information that in places where there is sufficient paddock accommodation not more than two cows may be kept for the use of the sub-officer or constable's family. Poultry, excepting geese, turkeys, and ducks, may be kept where there is no Government forage.

At all Stations where there is forage a special application must be made to the Inspector in charge of the district, who may grant permission if there is a proper fowl-house with only one opening from it into a paddock or road, but not into the station yard.

In no case will permission be given to keep cows or poultry in the barrack yard or close to it. Authority to keep a private horse can only be given by the Commissioner, and then good reasons must be assigned to warrant him in authorising the same.

Inspectors in charge of districts will be held strictly responsible that the privilege of keeping cows and poultry is not abused.

Getting around this CD

NAVIGATING ARCHIVE CD BOOKS CDs

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

SEARCHING TEXT ON ARCHIVE CD BOOKS AUSTRALIA CDs

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched.

The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

DIFFERENT VERSIONS OF ADOBE ACROBAT READER

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a "Find" and a "Search" tool. Those tools are two **totally** different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **FIND** tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a "Find" tool (not a "search" tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **FIND** tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a "Search" tool (not a tool labelled "Find")
HOWEVER — what is called "Search" is the same as the tool that used to be called "Find" Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the **SEARCH** tool

TIPS FOR SEARCHING AND GETTING MORE FROM THE CD BOOKS

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering "rederi" if you want "Frederick", but find that the letters "F" "c" and "k" are sometimes misread.
- use the "Match whole word" option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith
- use the "Match case" option when you want to eliminate all the occupations "smith" if you only want the name "Smith"
- Don't just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
 - look for others of the same name
 - look for others who lived in the same place or street
 - who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
 - how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
 - what churches were there and what time were services held?
 - what other activities were there in the community?
 - look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- All of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You could learn or write much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
