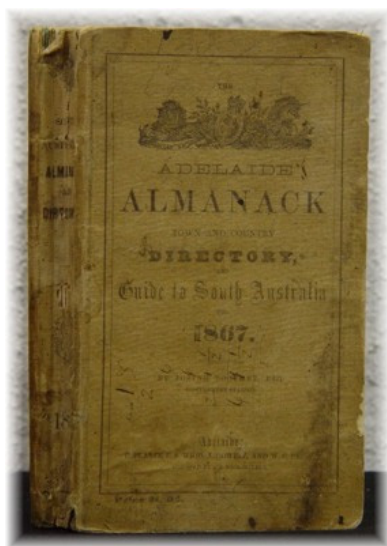

MEMORANDA.

THE
FARMERS', GARDENERS', AND VIGNERONS'
CALENDAR.

[REVISED BY GEORGE MCEWIN, ESQ., J.P.]

JANUARY.

THE PLAINS.

THE FARM.—As soon as the crop is harvested—which is generally the case this month—proceed with fallowing the new land. Plough up stubble land. Plough around stacks to prevent damage by fire.

KITCHEN GARDEN.—Continue to sow Cabbage and Cauliflower seed in shaded situations. Sow Celery seed. Keep Marrows, Melons, and Cucumbers clear of weeds, watering them when needed. Lift late crops of Onions. Sow Radishes, Mustard, and Cress.

FLOWER GARDEN.—Little will require to be done in the garden this month, except finishing the gathering of late flower-seeds, and attending to Amaryllis and Alstroemerias, which will bloom this month. Remove dead leaves and flower-stalks from the borders.

ORCHARD.—Gathering of ripe fruit will be the principal employments this month, and attention to supporting heavily-laden boughs props. Water young trees if the weather should prove very dry.

THE HILLS.

THE FARM.—Harvest operations will this month engross the farmers' attention. The principal topic for remark is the necessity of dispatch in having the grain safely housed. After the reaping-machine, the practice of winnowing in the field is not the most economical. By carting direct from the machine into the barn, the risk of damage to the heap from rain is removed, whilst the chaff may be saved and rendered available to mix with cattle-feed. Hand-reaped wheat will thrash most readily, if carted direct to the thrashing-floor without stacking.

Sow a few Turnips should rain fall. Do not altogether neglect the fallows and green crops. Earth up Potatoes.

KITCHEN GARDEN.—Broccoli may still be planted in moist situations. Cabbages and Cauliflowers may also be put out in similar ground, hoe and earth up advancing. Celery sow in moist shady spots, and water well till up, earth up advancing. Cucumbers attend to, and water copiously in morning or evening. Kidney Beans attend to, save seed from. Onions gather when stalks flag and assume a brown hue, spread and dry in the shade. Potatoes (ash-leaved kidney) plant for autumn crop, choose very light sandy soil, and manure highly. Seeds gather as they ripen.

FRUIT GARDEN.—Apricots gather as they ripen. Apples gather as they ripen. Prop up heavily-laden boughs. Budded trees attend to. Fruits in general attend to, and gather as they ripen. Newly planted trees water in dry weather.

FLOWER GARDEN.—Annuals, tie up tall flowering varieties, water. Bulbs may be planted end of the month. Budding of Roses, &c., finish early. Dead flower-stalks and leaves remove. Seeds gather as they ripen. Keep the borders and walks clean, and water copiously in dry weather.

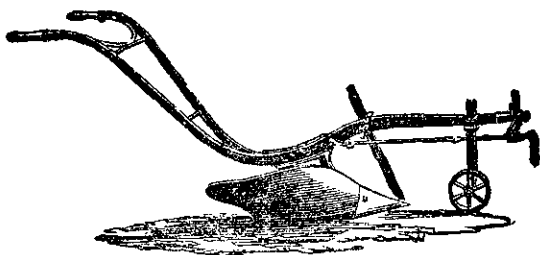

# Getting around this CD

## Navigating Archive CD Books CDs

---

All Archive CD Books products can be navigated easily using the handy bookmarks on each CD. The table of contents in most original books, and the original book index where it exists, can provide additional ways of finding the information required.

## Searching Text on Archive CD Books Australia CDs

---

Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology has been developing over the years as a useful mechanism to convert images (as Archive CD Books pages are) into text which can be searched. The quality of the OCR can still vary, and hence the searchability can vary. Around 95% or 99% of the words in books with good type are searchable—or even higher with very good type.

*OCR is now a wonderful searching aid in many instances  
but there is still no substitute for reading the book!*

## Different Versions of Adobe Acrobat Reader

---

Adobe Acrobat Reader 4 or later should be used. Adobe Reader 6 (as it is now named) in fact has considerably better searching options and is recommended.

- **Acrobat Reader v4** has both a “Find” and a “Search” tool. Those tools are two \*totally\* different things. Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the \*FIND\* tool
- **Acrobat Reader v5** has only a “Find” tool (not a “search” tool). Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the \*FIND\* tool.
- **Adobe Reader v6** has only a “Search” tool (not a tool labelled “Find”). HOWEVER — what is called “Search” is the same as the tool that used to be called “Find” Our CDs (that are searchable) work with the \*SEARCH\* tool

## Tips For Searching and Getting More From the CD Books

---

- update to Adobe Reader 6 for more versatile searching options, including the ability to bring up a list of all instances of the word you are searching for — across multiple files on a single CD in a single search request.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required.
- use Adobe Reader 6 to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list (Adobe 6 only). A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering “rederi” if you want “Frederick”, but find that the letters “F” “c” and “k” are sometimes misread.
- use the “Match whole word” option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith.
- use the “Match case” option to eliminate all the occupations “smith” if you only want the name “Smith”.
- don’t just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
  - › look for others of the same name
  - › look for others who lived in the same place or street
  - › who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
  - › how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
  - › what churches were there and what time were services held?
  - › what other activities were there in the community?
  - › look for others who had the same occupation or other interests
- all of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. You can learn much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
- Many CDs have only one file, but some have the book content spread over several files. Adobe Reader normally searches in the file that is open at the time. If you wish to search ALL files at once choose the “All PDF documents in” option and select the CD drive or directory the files are in—Adobe Reader 6 only.
