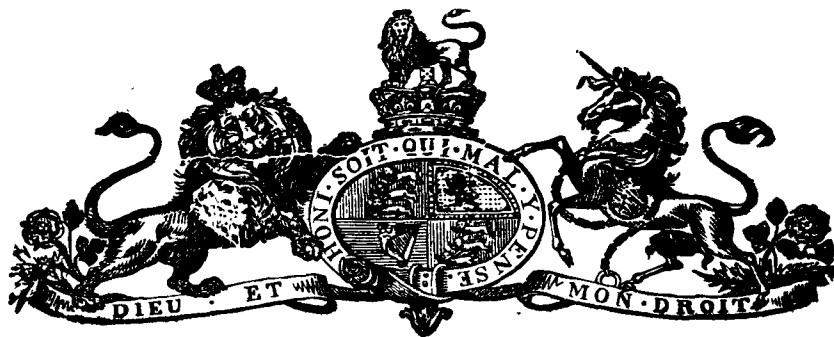

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT.

**NOTICE.**—All communications connected with "Police," for insertion herein, must be addressed to the Inspector of Police, Hobart; and every Report of Crime must be signed by a superior Officer of Police of the District or Municipality in which it is alleged to have been committed.

Whenever a reward is offered for the apprehension of an offender, such reward will not be inserted without a sufficient guarantee for the payment thereof accompanying the notice to the Inspector of Police.

Officers of Police are requested to peruse this Report carefully, and to notify to the Inspector of Police any information in reference to any notice therein of which they may become possessed, referring to the date and page of the Report containing the same.

A Duplicate of every Warrant issued and intended for publication in the Crime Report should accompany the notice thereof to this Office.

Officers of Police are requested to furnish in their reports of felonies, telegraphic or otherwise, full and specific information necessary not only to lead to the arrest of offenders but also to enable them to be properly charged before a Magistrate. Their attention is directed to the official Forms furnished to them for this purpose.

This course is likely to lead to difficulty when proceedings

are taken against witnesses who may neglect to attend in pursuance of their subpoenas at the Criminal Sittings. A copy of the subpoena should always be served personally upon the witness, and at the same time the original subpoena shown to him, but should it be found impossible to serve a witness personally this fact must be immediately reported to the Attorney-General.

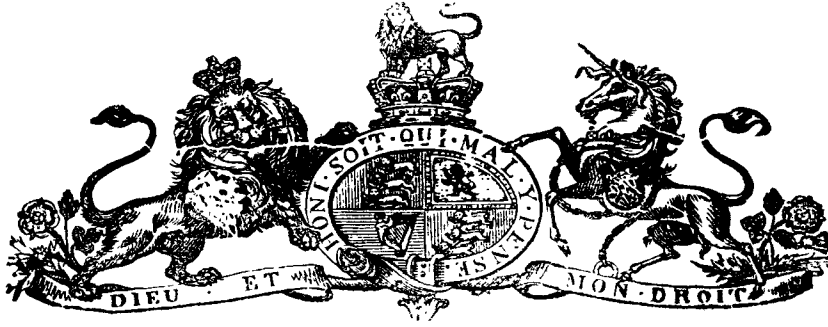

# General Tips

## for searching and getting more from Archive CD Books products

- update to version 6 or later of Adobe Reader at [www.adobe.com](http://www.adobe.com) for the best searching capability.
- enter the MINIMUM number of characters needed to bring up the search results required
- use Adobe Reader to do some trial searches to try to identify the characters that may be misread. These can show up in the extra text in the search results list. A few minutes trial will help you to avoid using characters that are more prone to being misread, e.g. try entering "rederi" if you want "Frederick", but find that the letters "F" "c" and "k" are sometimes misread.
- use the "Match whole word" option to eliminate unnecessary items in your results list, e.g. to eliminate all the blacksmiths and tinsmiths etc when you only want the name Smith
- use the "Match case" option when you want to eliminate all the occupations "smith" if you only want the name "Smith"
- Don't just search for names. Search the book for other names, places and subjects of interest:
  - look for others of the same name
  - look for others who lived in the same place or street
  - who was the postmaster or police officer in the town?
  - how often and at what time did the coach arrive in town?
  - what churches were there and what time were services held?
  - what other activities were there in the community?
  - look for others who had the same occupation or other interests

All of this and more may be available in a seemingly mundane book such as a directory. Learn much of the background of life at the time, even if your ancestor is not listed there.
